## **Further Academic Progress!**

Further evidence of significant progress in key subjects has been reported by the Interim Headteachers in the recent test results. Do look out for them in the school bulletin. It is very pleasing to see that our pupils are developing a sound foundation of skills in maths and literacy. In many cases, the results are comparable with national expectations, which is a great improvement from this time last year.

This progress results from hard work by the pupils themselves, taught by skilful staff, and supported by their families at home. Well done, everybody, you are making a strong positive difference for Westcott's pupils!

#### Academisation

We were very surprised and disappointed to hear that ODBST have chosen to withdraw from taking Westcott CofE into their Multi-Academy Trust. A key reason cited for this was the lack of a long-term lease on part of the school site: this is all of the school land behind the main school buildings. It's used not just for play and forest school, but also for the library and other teaching space.

The governing board is working with ODBE and Bucks Council to understand the implications of the ODBST decision and the land issue.

#### Year 5 and 6 End of Year Performance

It was a great pleasure to attend the performance by years 5 and 6 recently. A very entertaining presentation with comedy dialogue and songs. It was great to see so many of the children engaging with the show with such commitment and enthusiasm, regardless of whether they aspire to become pop stars! Luckily the rain held off long enough, and the performance was well attended by our families.

A big thank you to Miss Cobb for her work preparing and directing the show.

After the show, our Year 6 pupils were given their **Leavers' Hoodies**, which they were invited to wear in school until the end of term. Generous funding by the PFA meant that all Year 6 pupils could have a hoody. **Thank you, the PFA.**
